# Letter from the Chair



Hello RBC Members and Friends!

I hope everyone is enjoying the changing season and getting in quality rides with the last few weeks of nice weather. I have a few non-riding matters that I wish to share with you:

- <u>Annual meeting</u>: by now you will have received word of the annual meeting to be held on November 12. For the 40th anniversary of the Club, we decided to upgrade from past years with a new venue and a compelling guest speaker. We are honored to have 2022 USA Cycling Women's Road Race National Champion <u>Emma Langely</u> speak about her career on the World Tour and what cycling means to her. Emma will bring her Super Six Evo decked out in the US champion colors for us mortals to ogle. The Club is also going to be recognizing Dave and Beth Meyer and the Green Lizard for 10 years as the breathing heart of the local cycling community. I hope you can attend.
- <u>Board Elections</u>: If you have ever said (or thought) while out riding "*Reston Bike Club should....*" now is your opportunity to make that thought come to life. See the details in the next section and use the link to submit your nomination. If you don't want to take on one of the formal board positions, we also always need folks to help out with all manner of tasks large and small that are needed to keep a club our size running smoothly. Most of these tasks can be addressed as needed or otherwise don't interfere with <u>Rule 11</u>. Election results will be announced at the annual meeting.
- Lastly, an observation on support to the cycling community: each year, the Club receives outstanding support from local law enforcement who help ensure the safety of Century riders. Fairfax, Herndon, Leesburg, Purcellville Police forces in particular go out of their way to assist with the Century. We likewise are also deeply grateful for the EMS support provided by Hamilton, Fairfax, and Ashburn units. Regrettably, for many years now, the Loudoun County Sheriff's Department has steadfastly declined to meet with the Club to discuss the Century or generally cyclist safety in the County. Tuesday, 7 November is Election Day, and I encourage club members to engage candidates for office and let them know that cycling is an important part of their community and seek their support.

## 5's @ 5 Ride - Winter Schedule

We are in the peak of the fall riding season and the "Fives" rides are drawing more riders than ever. One question I frequently get is "how long will I continue to post during the week." The answer is "all winter long."

When we set the clocks back on November 5<sup>th</sup> the fives ride will start an hour earlier at 4 pm. And all rides will start from Herndon art space. The routes will vary due to available daylight but expect 20-23 miles that would include an out and back on the trail and an Ashburn loop. Front and rear lights are a must of course especially for the last 5 miles on the trail.

My bigger challenge is the weather. I will post rides on better weather days of the week, so it may not always be a Tuesday or Thursday. When I post a ride, I'm looking for days that are above 50 degrees, dry road conditions, and winds under 15 MPH. And if the weather is bad on a ride day, I'll cancel the ride. Reflecting on last year, I think we were able to ride at least once almost every week.

I can't predict what the weather will be like this winter but with a little planning and some winter gear there should be plenty of riding opportunities so I may not have to use the dreaded "indoor trainer" Ride safe!
